Description: Approximately 100 acres 2.5 miles with 11trails

Location: 7849 DuPont Rd. West ¹/₂ mi. on DuPont Rd (Rt. 892) from intersection with Rt. 50. Look for the sign

Permitted Activities: Run, Walk/Hike, Photography, Birding, Outdoor Ed.

shown to the left. Parking located at trailhead.

Restrictions:

- Open Dawn to Dusk
- No bicycles or motorized vehicles
- No alcohol, illegal drugs, or fires
- Do not litter or pick vegetation
- No swimming
- No firearms, hunting or fishing
- Use is restricted to marked trails
- Do not enter during high winds
